

The National Association of Police Organizations – in partnership with Volvo Cars of North America, AAA, and Partners for Highway Safety – is proud to announce that **“Drive for Life: The National Safe Driving Test,”** a national television special on driving-safety, is premiering Saturday, August 30th at 7 p.m. on the PAX TV network.

FOX Sports anchor Chris Myers and Indy Racing League star Greg Ray host the 30-minute television program. As the centerpiece for one of the most ambitious driver safety initiatives ever undertaken, **“The National Safe Driving Test”** aims to help drivers of all abilities and ages to identify gaps in safe-driving practices and knowledge. At the program’s core is multiple-choice quiz that tests a driver’s knowledge while highlighting the dos and don’ts of everyday driving experiences.

In a recent nationwide poll over 90% of drivers admitted to risky behavior. The results showed that today’s drivers carry out a variety of distracting tasks while behind the wheel, including eating, reading, putting on makeup, and even changing clothes. The National Safe Driving Test was created in response to a prevailing attitude among drivers that, “I’m the safe driver, it’s the other people on the road that are causing trouble.”

With an increasing number of injuries and fatalities caused by risky driving behavior and easily preventable accidents, NAPO along with Volvo Cars of North America, Partners for Highway Safety, the National Sheriff’s Association, and the Broward Sheriff’s Office—would like to stress the importance of good driving habits and awareness on the road through one of the largest national driving campaigns initiated in decades.
