JOHNSON, CAE Executive Director and General Counsel On behalf of the National Association of Police Organizations (NAPO), representing over 241,000 sworn law enforcement officers across the country, I am writing to urge you to include direct, flexible funding to state and local governments in this next COVID-19 relief package.

State and local governments big and small are struggling with budget holes and significant revenue losses due to the pandemic and the steps that had to be taken to protect the public. As a result, police departments across the country have told their officers that department civilian staff are being furloughed and laid off and that they will be next for furlough and layoffs. This is at a time when law enforcement agencies are stretched to their limits between the impact of the virus on police forces and rising violent crime rates across the country. Law enforcement and public safety will be negatively impacted if direct, flexible funding is not given to state and local governments to help them offset budget and revenue shortfalls created by these crises.

Without this aid, police departments across the nation will essentially be defunded as officers are laid off, academy classes are canceled, community policing programs are gutted and vital training is postponed. Aid to state and local governments is essential to ensuring we are able to retain trained and experienced officers and law enforcement agencies are able to continue to serve and protect the public.
